## From our Associate Minister .....



Dear Church,

It's hard to write a letter to all of you during yet another blizzard without wondering how all of your spirits are keeping up with all this snow. Such weather can certainly weigh heavily on the psyche for some, inconvenience most others, and have particularly dire consequences for those who depend on hourly-wage income, the frail, impaired, or differently abled. Let's all remember to keep each other in prayer and let each other know we're doing that when we see each other! This is some intense weather! Let's also all feel free to be checking in on one another!

I know we don't often talk about Saints in our tradition but I can't help but think of the feast of St. Brigid which falls during this time of year and is widely celebrated in Ireland. She is the patron St. of fires, poetry, healing, midwifery, and the home/hearth. Her feast day is called, "Imbolc," which means, "in the belly." Imbolc falls appropriately smack in the middle of winter. Perhaps we can all relate to this feeling of being, "in the belly," as we find ourselves encased in snow, in the dark of winter, with still more winter to come. A tradition people have of celebrating St. Brigid's day is shutting off all the lights in the house and then bringing a light in from outside to the fire-place. The lights in the house are then lit from that light and neighbors visit each other! It marks a time of going inward to kindle a flame from within. It is a time of becoming warmth for others!

During this time, "in the belly," we also find ourselves in the season of Lent, our spiritual incubation period that marks the time of Christ's journey into the wilderness for 40 days. For us we can experience Lent as a time where we also hear the Spirit pulling us deeper into the wilderness of our soul, directing us to look more closely, calling us to hear the still small voice deep within, and quietly inviting us into the process of death and resurrection where Christ leads us. In this incubation period, "in the belly," we have an opportunity to let go of and give up what no longer serves us and live into what we know God has made us to be. It would seem we don't have to go literally into the wilderness this year! The wilderness has come to us! Let's remember during lent that we as a church can be the spiritual warmth for one another in winter and throughout the season of Lent while we heal, as we let go, and as we go inward to kindle the inner flame that melts away the heart's ice on the journey toward Easter.

## Fill Eggs for 'One Egg Haiti'

The RIC-UCC Haiti Task Force started a food program a year and a half ago feeding children in Haiti one hard boiled egg every day. They partnered with the 'One Egg Haiti' program to do this. Currently they feed children in 3 orphanages and 2 schools.



On Sunday, February 8<sup>th</sup>, our church began raising money for the 'One Egg Haiti'. The congregation was invited to take home and fill plastic eggs with money for the campaign. Filled eggs can be returned to church each week and placed in the 'nest' on the table in the narthex (near where the greeters stand). They can be *eggchanged* for empty ones which are in a basket beside the 'nest'. The program will be running through Lent and is raising money to provide an egg a day for impoverished children in Haiti.

Why eggs? Because one egg has 70 calories, almost every essential vitamin and mineral and many other beneficial food components. Egg protein is thought to be the highest quality of protein. As of today, approximately 500 children are receiving one egg a day. In addition, it is hoped that communities will start their own poultry farms creating sustainable jobs for Haitians.

Here are some suggestions for setting goals:

15 cents provides one egg for one child for one day.

\$60 can feed one child an egg every day for a year.

Each egg can hold at least 45 pennies or 32 quarters or 25 nickels or 50 dimes or 6 bills


