

Maundy Thursday: There will be a Service of Tenebrae on MAUNDY THURSDAY, APRIL 13TH at 7 pm in the sanctuary. The deacons and ministers lead this worship service in which the story of Jesus' passion and suffering is read, with candles extinguished one by one. The service also includes communion and music. All are invited to deepen their experience of the resurrection by living through the passion and death of Christ in this contemplative service.

Good Friday Walk: You are invited to join the ministers (Dale and Brendan) on GOOD FRIDAY, APRIL 14TH for a prayerful walk through town during which we will pause at certain points to reflect on the seven final statements uttered by Christ from the cross. On the walk we will take time to honor Christ's passion together and meditate on the presence of the cross as well as the living Christ in our own community and in our lives. The walk will begin at the church at Noon and will be 3.2 miles long – ending up back at the church. We hope you can join us for this sacred time.

Did you know...... After the establishment of the Town in 1717, the Rev. Samuel Torrey became the first minister of the Town and Church. His term must have been satisfactory until December of 1725 when his request for a salary increase was denied. In June of 1726 the request was again denied by the Town and Church and it was agreed to dismiss the Rev. Torrey, thus a search for a new minister began. A new settled minister was hard to come by. After approximately five different candidates for the position, Mr. Peleg Heath was called and accepted as the new minister in 1728. His was a colorful term of 12 years which will be explained in a later issue.
