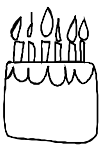

The 6 questions are:

1. Name a significant faith experience/event in the life of this church?
2. Name a significant challenging faith experience/event in the life of this church in the last 3 years?
3. What is great about this church?
4. What needs shoring up in this church/ministry?
5. What is God calling this church to be/become in the next 5 years?
6. If money were no problem, how would we dream?

The chats are your opportunity to talk with Rev. Sue, members of the Search Committee and the Stewardship Team, about the future of our church, our joys and concerns, and our stewardship needs. Your thoughts and suggestions are important as we begin the process of searching for a new Senior Minister, and so we hope you will be able to attend one.
