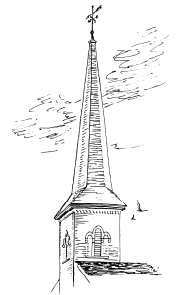

Dear friends,

We made it! The season of Easter is upon us and with spring approaching we are starting to see signs of resurrection! How do we become part of the process of resurrection? How do we live resurrection? We have probably all heard the story of the starfish. It's an oldie but a goodie! The starfish story tells of a little girl walking up and down the beach covered in dried up starfish dying in the Sun. As she throws them back in the ocean one by one a man asks her why she even bothers trying to help them. He says to her, "you can't possibly help all the starfish!" 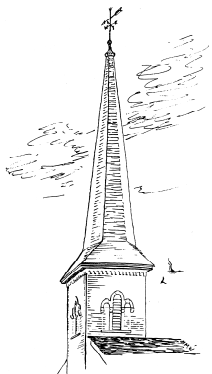
