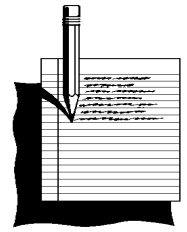

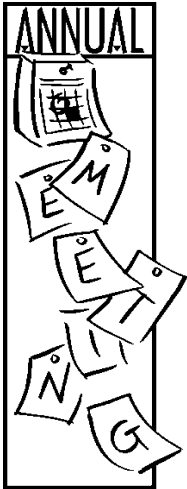

From your Buildings and Grounds Ministry Team.....

Church Clean Up Day - postponed due to rain being forecast, to Sunday, April 27th from 1—4 pm

It's not too late to come and help! Volunteers — both skilled and unskilled — are welcome, so please come and help with some much needed work around the church and grounds - even if it's only for an hour.

There is always lots of yard work that needs to get done so if possible please bring garden tools for working on the grounds. Work gloves are also recommended for all volunteers. The Boy Scouts from Troop 6 will also be volunteering and will be helping with various projects including sweeping up the sand from the parking lots.



Ongoing green energy HVAC improvements in the offices and library

The boiler conversion from oil to gas is complete and work is currently underway on the installation of new more efficient and effective heating and air conditioning systems in the offices and the church library. This means much lower fuel costs, at least a 25% reduction in CO₂ emissions, and a more comfortable workplace.

We have been able to move ahead with this work thanks in part to several very generous donations from church members. We thank them for their generosity.

Landscaping Update

A group of interested church members met recently to discuss long term plans for the church landscaping. Several priorities were set as a result of this property walk around and energetic idea sharing session:

- Plant a Kousa Dogwood tree in the garden area that adjoins the Library. Remove the yew bushes from that garden area and add durable plant materials to the already existing plantings in that garden.
- Add juniper bushes to the grassy area between the parking spaces in front of the Education Building and County Road to continue the bush line.
- Install new bushes and small plantings to the area where the new gas line is located.

The Ugandan Model of Ecumenism, “Delicious Peace”

Sunday, May 4th at 2:30 pm at Temple Habonim

“*Delicious Peace: Coffee, Music and Religious Harmony in Uganda*” tells the story of JJ Keki, an Abayudayan, who traveled on foot, knocking on the doors of his Jewish, Christian and Muslim neighbors, asking them to put aside their differences and to join him to create an extraordinary partnership based on trust and emphasizing peace. Thus, Delicious Peace (Mirembe Kawomera), a cooperative of small-scale farmers came together to grow Fair Trade coffee. To promote their endeavor, they compose music, encouraging others to work alongside.

Guest speaker will be Rabbi Jeffrey Summit who serves as Tufts University Jewish Chaplain and Director of Tufts Hillel. He is a renowned ethnomusicologist and a Research Professor in the Department of Music and the Judaic Studies Programs at Tufts. He has researched their music for the past 14 years, and has recorded their rhythms and harmonies in a Grammy nominated CD. The Independent Music Awards also just nominated it for “Best Traditional World Music” album.

The program will feature their songs and will tell their compelling story of interfaith peace, an inspiration for us all.

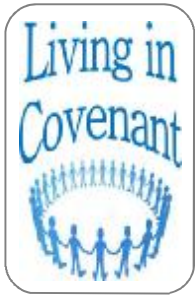

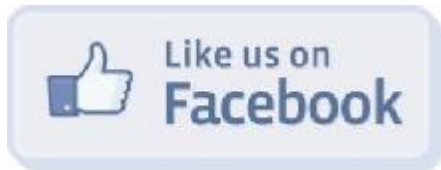

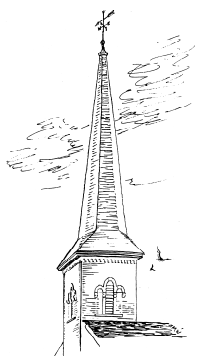
